We are recruiting to a new role within One Health Lewisham for a GP Champion for HIV. The post holder will work with local communities in order to improve detection and treatment for HIV in the local population, especially supporting those from more vulnerable groups, whilst considering the social determinants of health, community empowerment and collaboration in order to improve the HIV service in Lewisham.

The clinical lead will be required to be working in a Lewisham General Practice (salaried, regular sessional or partner) and we will be encouraging those interested to apply via the Lewisham GP fellowship scheme (which has a package of support and leadership training).

The role is offered as a 1 year fixed-term post.

ONE HEALTH LEWISHAM

One Health Lewisham is a GP Federation established in 2017 that has grown out of four neighbourhood GP federations in the North, Centre, South East and South West of the South London Borough of Lewisham. OHL works to develop pan Lewisham ways of working, reduce variation, improve quality and support GP Practices. Services provided by OHL include the GP Extended Access Service, care home support, coordinated care service for all practices in Lewisham, the GP Resilience Programme and various other innovative projects.

HIV in Lewisham

Lewisham had an estimated population of 275,000 in 2011. Lewisham is one of the 20% most deprived districts/unitary authorities in England. Life expectancy for men is lower than the England average. Health inequalities Life expectancy is 7.1 years lower for men and 5.5 years lower for women in the most deprived areas of Lewisham than in the least deprived areas. 47% of the population were black and ethnic minority in 2011. Lewisham is the 15th most ethnically diverse local authority in England. Lewisham has 8th highest rate of HIV in London (8.2 per 1000 people). It is estimated that 1 in 5 people in London do not know they have HIV. Therefore, this can be assumed that there are also high numbers of people in Lewisham who do not know they have HIV. 46% of those diagnosed in Lewisham are diagnosed late and hence may have already have complications.

GP HIV CHAMPION ROLE

DELIVERABLES

The main benefits that we want this role to deliver against are:

- Engagement with primary care clinicians around diagnosis and management of HIV and those living with HIV
- Teaching and training around HIV in primary care
- Reduce stigma associated with HIV patient care
- Improve communication with secondary care and improve relationships between primary and secondary care HIV services
- Lead on quality improvement for HIV across Lewisham General Practices

- Lead on development and management of HIV screening services across practices
- Improve engagement of patients living with HIV with health services

MANAGEMENT AND REPORTING

Line Management: The GP Champion for HIV will report to the Medical Director and ultimately to the CEO and board of One Health Lewisham.

Reporting: The GP Champion for HIV will produce quarterly reports and documentation for projects e.g. project plans, measurable outcomes / KPIs for the particular projects, details of data gathered, reporting regarding sustainability and outcomes
